2018 Business Innovation Award

The John A. Hartford Foundation (JAHF) Business Innovation Award was created to highlight successful partnerships between community-based organizations (CBOs) and health care entities, such as hospitals and health plans, and spur the replication of these partnerships nationwide.

The award recognizes one or more CBOs that have made significant strides through the development of partnerships with health care entities to improve the quality of life for older adults and/or people with disabilities. Nominees should demonstrate the pursuit of bold, transformative initiatives designed to integrate health care and long-term services and supports.

ELIGIBILITY:

Nominations for an array of CBOs that work in the Aging and Disability Networks are encouraged. Eligible recipients include, but are not limited to, Area Agencies on Aging, Centers for Independent Living, faith-based organizations and other community-based service providers.

Qualified submissions will successfully showcase an innovative health care partnership model that has resulted in the improved quality of life for older adults and/or people with disabilities.

Organizations are permitted to nominate themselves.

SELECTION OF RECIPIENT(S):

Award winner(s) will be chosen by a review committee that consists of The John A. Hartford Foundation staff, health care representatives and community-based organizations. One or more nominees will be eligible for selection.

Award winner(s) will be announced at n4a's 43rd Annual Conference in Chicago in July 2018. Award winners will receive a plaque and a monetary award of up to \$5,000.
